Wildlife-vehicle collisions result in more than 200 human deaths, 26,000 human injuries, and cost Americans more than \$8 billion dollars each year. An estimated 1-2 million crashes occur annually between motorists and large wildlife in the United States - about one every 26 seconds! This doesn't include the millions of smaller animals killed each year in collisions that don't result in human injury or property damage, and thus are typically not reported. \*

**Blakeley Adkins**, wildlife technician, bear-viewing guide and community outreach specialist, works on wildlife issues in the northwest. Her focus includes helping locals live on the landscape with wildlife and implementing wildlife crossings. Join us to learn more about reducing wildlife-vehicle collisions and reconnecting habitat fragmented by roads.
